In today's message, we'll look at how King Solomon laid the foundations, pursued the plans, & completed the process for founding, finishing, & furnishing a Temple dedicated to God. <u>1 Kings 5:1-5</u>

¹ When Hiram king of Tyre heard that Solomon had been anointed king to succeed his father David, he sent... envoys to Solomon, because he had always been on friendly terms with David.² Solomon sent back this message....³ "You know that because of the wars waged against my father...from all sides, he could not build a temple for... God until the LORD put his enemies under his feet. ⁴ But now the LORD my God has given me rest on every side, & there is no adversary or disaster. ⁵ I intend, therefore, to build a temple for the Name of the LORD my God, as the LORD told my father David, when He said, 'Your son whom I will put on the throne in your place will build the temple for My Name.'

2 Chronicles 2:1-10

¹[So] Solomon gave orders to build a temple for the Name of the LORD & a royal palace for himself.² He conscripted 70,000 men as carriers & 80,000 as stonecutters in the hills & 3,600 as foremen over them.³ Solomon sent this message to Hiram king of Tyre: "Send me cedar logs as you did for my father David... to build a palace to live in.⁴ Now I am about to build a temple for the Name of the LORD my God & to dedicate it to Him for burning fragrant incense before Him, for setting out the consecrated bread regularly [DAILY], & for making burnt offerings every morning & evening [HOURS] & on the Sabbaths [WEEKLY], at the New Moons [MONTHLY] & at the appointed festivals [SEASONALLY, ANNUALLY] of the LORD our God. This is a lasting ordinance for Israel [ONGOINGLY].

2 Chronicles 2:1-10

⁵ The temple I am going to build will be great, because our God is greater than all other gods. ⁶ But who is able to build a temple for Him, since... even the highest heavens, cannot contain Him? Who then am I to build a temple for Him, except as a place to burn sacrifices before Him? ⁷ Send me, therefore, a man skilled to work in [fine materials] & experienced in the art of engraving, to work [here] with my skilled workers, <u>whom my</u> father David provided.⁸ Send me also cedar, juniper & algum logs from Lebanon, for I know that your servants are skilled in cutting timber there. My servants will work with yours ⁹ to provide me with plenty of lumber, because the temple I build must be large & magnificent.¹⁰ I will give your... woodsmen [thousands of tons of provisions of] ground wheat...barley...wine &...olive oil."

<u>1 Kings 5:7-12</u>

⁷ When Hiram heard Solomon's message, he was greatly pleased & said, "Praise be to the LORD today, for He has given David a wise son to rule over this great nation." ⁸ So Hiram sent word to Solomon: "I have received the message you sent me & will do all you want....⁹ And you are to grant my wish by providing food for my royal household." ¹⁰ In this way Hiram kept Solomon supplied with all the cedar & juniper logs he wanted, ¹¹ & Solomon gave Hiram twenty thousand cors of wheat as food for his household, in addition to twenty thousand baths of pressed olive oil. Solomon continued to do this for Hiram year after year. ¹² The LORD gave Solomon wisdom, just as He had promised him. There were peaceful relations between Hiram & Solomon, and the two of them made a treaty.

1 Kings 6:1-9 - THE HOUSE IMMANUEL

¹ In the four hundred & eightieth [LXX: fortieth] year after the Israelites came out of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel [APPROX. 960 BC], in the... second month, he began to build the temple of the LORD....⁷ In building the temple, only blocks dressed at the quarry were used, & no hammer, chisel or any other iron tool was heard at the temple site while it was being built [SEE Ex 20:25, "If you make an altar of stones for Me, do not build it with dressed stones, for you will defile it if you use a tool on it; " CF. DT 27:5-6]. ⁹ So he built the temple and completed it, roofing it with beams & cedar....

2 Chronicles 3:1-3 - ON THE THRESHING FLOOR

¹ Then Solomon began to build the temple of the LORD in Jerusalem on Mount Moriah [CF. GEN 22], where the LORD had appeared to his father David. It was on the threshing **floor** of Araunah the Jebusite, the place provided by David [2] SAM 24; 1 CH 21]. 2 He began building on the second day of the second month in the fourth year of his reign. ³ The foundation Solomon laid for building the temple of God was [about ninety feet] long and [about twenty feet]....⁶ He adorned the temple with **precious stones** [&] gold of Parvaim....¹⁰ For the Most Holy Place he made a pair of sculptured cherubim and overlaid them with gold.

<u>2 Chronicles 3:17 - BETWEEN THE PILLARS</u>

¹⁷ [Solomon] erected **the pillars in the front of the temple**, one to the south & one to the north. The one to the south he named **Jakin** [*PROBABLY*: "**He Establishes**"] & the one to the north **Boaz** [*PROBABLY*: "**In Him Is Strength**"].

<u>1 Kings 6:11-38 - THE HOUSE IMMANUEL</u>

¹¹ The word of the LORD came to Solomon: ¹² "As for this temple you are building, if you follow My decrees, observe My laws and keep all My commands & obey them, I will fulfill through you the promise I gave to David your father. ¹³ And I will live among the Israelites & will not abandon My people Israel." ¹⁴ So Solomon built the temple & completed it. ... ¹⁹ He prepared the inner sanctuary within the temple to set the Ark of the Covenant...there....³⁷ The foundation...was laid in the fourth year, in the month of Ziv. ³⁸ In the eleventh year in the...eighth month, the temple was finished in all its details according to its

specifications. He had spent seven years building it.

3. DEDICATED THINGS: Furnishing 1 Kg 7 / 2 Ch 4

1 Kings 7:1-12 - Solomon's Royal Palace Complex

¹ It took Solomon thirteen years, however, to complete the construction of his palace. ²⁻¹² He built:

- the Palace of the Forest of Lebanon
- the throne hall, the **Hall of Justice**, where he was to judge
- the **palace in which he was to live**, set farther back
- a **palace like this hall for his wife**, Pharaoh's daughter
- the great courtyard
- the inner courtyard of the LORD's temple with its portico

3. DEDICATED THINGS: Furnishing 1 Kg 7 / 2 Ch 4

<u>1 Kings 7:13-50 - The Temple Furnishings</u>

¹³ King Solomon sent to Tyre & brought **Huram**, ¹⁴ **whose** *mother* **was a widow** *from the tribe of Naphtali* & whose *father* was *from Tyre & a skilled craftsman* in bronze. <u>Huram was filled</u> <u>with wisdom</u>, with understanding & with knowledge to do **all** kinds of bronze work.

THESE FURNISHINGS INCLUDED:

- Broze Pillars & Assorted Fine Decorative Arts
- Bronze Sea of Cast Metal Atop 12 Sculpted Bronze Bulls
- Bronze Stands, Engraved Panels, & Basins
- **Pots**, **Shovels**, & **Bowls** for Performing the Temple Rites

3. DEDICATED THINGS: Furnishing 1 Kg 7 / 2 Ch 4

2 Chronicles 4:18-22 - The Temple Furnishings

¹⁸ All these things that Solomon made **amounted to so much** that the weight of the bronze could not be calculated. ¹⁹ Solomon also made all the furnishings that were in God's temple: the golden altar; the tables on which was the Bread of the Presence; ²⁰ the **lampstands** of pure gold with their lamps...²¹ the gold floral work and lamps & tongs (they were solid gold); ²² the pure **gold wick trimmers**, **sprinkling** bowls, dishes & censers; and the gold doors of the temple: the **inner doors** to the Most Holy Place and the **doors of the** main hall.

3. DEDICATED THINGS: Furnishing | 1 Kg 7 / 2 Ch 4

<u>1 Kings 7:51 - The Temple Furnishings</u>

⁵¹ When all the work King Solomon had done for the temple of the LORD was **finished**, **he brought in <u>the things his father David had dedicated</u>– the silver and gold and the furnishings**–and he **placed them in the treasuries of the LORD**'s temple.
